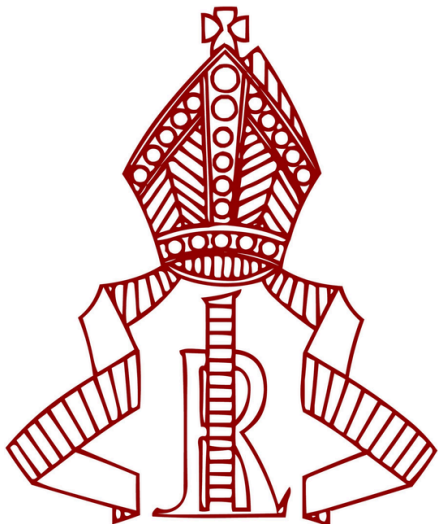

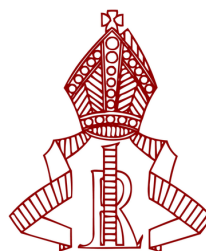

D&T - TEXTILES

Students of Textiles can not only focus on the content from 'Design & Technology (Product Design)' but also look on their Google Classroom where there will be a folder of work named 'Revision'.

Here the students will find examples of:

- Pasted exam questions and answers broken down into small manageable chunks.
- All the past theory lesson Powerpoints and question sheets.
- Links to Online Resources: BBC Bitesize, AQA GCSE D&T for concise notes, Kerboodle quizzes, and TechnologyStudent.com for visual aids.
- Flashcards & Mind Maps: Use flashcards for key terms, fabric properties, and technical specifications, especially for testing yourself.
- Recommended Revision Guides.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE

- Go to the Google Site for English Language and Literature, for past papers, mark schemes and model answers for both English Language and Literature. Do not assume that you can't revise English Language - you need to practise past paper questions! And read short stories and opinion articles in the media. Apply the same questions from the exam papers to these texts.
- Creative writing tasks are worth half of your overall marks for English Language. For Paper 1, think about re-writing part of a story or a film you have seen to try and develop your skills. For Paper 2, choose a 'controversial' topic and try to write something persuasive, arguing one side or another. Don't forget to look back at the green penning from your recent mocks to see what you need to improve on.

ENGLISH LITERATURE

- Choose a theme from a text and then either bullet point a plan of what you would write about if they came up in an exam. Write practice paragraphs, remembering to formulate a thesis (a Big Idea).
- Re-read the texts you have studied. Make sure you know them inside-out. Don't feel you have to spend endless hours revising quotes – the key part is being able to answer the question and talk about the author's overall intention. If you are unsure about a character or theme, then of course, find examples from the text which help you understand them further.

FOOD PREPARATION & NUTRITION

FURTHER MATHS

- Look up topics and subtopics in your textbooks, and attempt the groups of practice questions which accompany the notes. Questions toward the end of exercises are more challenging, so use those to really push yourself.

This website is where you'll find past papers. Try to sit papers under exam conditions to give yourself more familiarity with timing. Remember, this is a 2-hour paper for 100 marks!

GEOGRAPHY

- You have completed the course for Paper 1 and 2 and now have the pre release for paper 3. After Easter we will do a Paper 3 Mock Exam. Tasks and resources for easter revision are in this assignment on Google Classroom.
 1. Make a mindmap/ flash cards of your Physical Fieldwork (river Lavant) and Human Fieldwork (Chichester) (2 hours per mindmap)
 2. Read and make a mindmap of the pre release (3 hours)
 3. Complete the Paper 3 exam paper (1 hour 30 mins)
 4. Finally, go through check list for Paper 1 and Paper 2 - identify weaknesses and revise these (all resources on google classroom)

GERMAN

- Every student has access to Kerboodle (online AQA GCSE German textbook) - please check your login at home works and advise Mrs Williams asap if you need it reset
- Link [here](#) to Quizlet to practise vocabulary for all the sub topics within the 3 themes - link is also on Arbor.
- Use your Grammar, Vocabulary and Translation Workbook to complete activities on each topic within the 3 themes
- Make sure that you are confident in using and recognising key verbs in past/present/future tenses (verb tables page 90 in workbook)
- Learn answers to your General Conversation questions for the 3 themes - in your booklets and on Google Classroom - Speaking exams 27th & 28th April
- Make a free account on Revision World to access Past Papers - this year will be the first year of GCSE - all questions will be in English
- See Google classroom for sample papers and questions from new specification

HISTORY

- Use the Revision Booklet that you received in class a few weeks ago to do some practice questions. There are questions for every topic, and every style of question.
- Label as many sources as you can! What can you learn? What is their message?
- The Revision Booklet also has checklists for every topic. Use this to help create a revision timetable. Also use it to colour code your confidence with each topic, so you can see where you may need to spend more or less time.
- Use Seneca for quick knowledge checks. Sections on all 4 GCSE units: Germany, Conflict & Tension 1918-39, Health & Medicine, The Normans.
- Green-pen past answers, including mocks. Feel confident that you know how to improve your work. Make sure that you are regularly looking at the History Revision Classroom (4jimeled). There are regular updates, with weekly questions set, copies of notes from revision sessions, and updates on upcoming revision sessions.
- Watch the revision videos made by Mr Barnett for every topic. QR codes/links can be found on the Revision Classroom, and have been sent home as well.
- [BBC Bitesize](#): (videos on Germany, Medicine and Normans).

MATHS

- You have all now completed the course for Maths. The best way to revise maths is to do as many questions as you can- particularly in exam format so you get used to how the questions are laid out. Past papers are amazing revision and you can find them all [here](#), with mark schemes and grade boundaries. If you get to a question you cannot do, prioritise this topic, particularly if it appears earlier in the paper.

- Maths Genie booklets by topic [here](#), and you can see roughly what grade they are too.
- If you have no idea what topics you are currently finding difficult, we would recommend the “One Question Per Topic” booklet for [Foundation](#) or [Higher](#) to help you know what to focus on next. Use the video to support you via the QR code or 1stclassmaths YouTube channel.
- Mrs Kettle has written a “best guess” exam paper for Paper 1 (Non-Calc) and filmed the solutions. You will be given a copy of this before you break up for Easter, but you can see them and previous ones [here](#).

- You will all have a printed revision guide to take away over Easter, to assist you with the key content.
- Our top tip is to focus on having secure knowledge of the [core beliefs in Islam and Christianity](#). If you know these, you **can** answer any question. **Be confident- you can do it!**

SCIENCE

Students have their own homepage on [Carousel](#) - the knowledge retrieval tool.

Students will be issued an assignment with a link to Carousel Science study packs. We recommend using the study packs in the following way:

1) Revise flashcards from one of the topics, remember the process for good revision.

- Write down the answer to a flash card question
- Check it and then tick or cross your written answer.
- If incorrect, remember to click "wrong" or "nearly right" and you will then see this question again.
- Repeat this process until you are getting them all fully correct.

2) Generate a 5-10 question quiz on the topic and test yourself. This ideally would be done after a break, but do it whenever you can. Remember to write down answers and do corrections.

3) Repeat this process for each of the topics, ideally come back to ones that you were less successful with.

SPANISH

- Verb ending tables and irregular verbs. Make sure that you are confident in using and recognising key verbs in past / present / future tenses!

- Topic relates "Cinturones" (essential vocabulary for all topics).
- All Spanish Samples of New GCSEs released by AQA (you can practise all the skills: listening, reading, writing and speaking).
- Spanish Revision Booklet. Spanish Past Papers(old exam but same topics so please do some!) Spanish Speaking Booklet. Please, practice some common topic questions. It is likely that similar questions will be used by the examiners in your conversation and in the writing paper.
