

Overview	The GCSE History curriculum covers international, and British, history. Within Y10 the focus is on international history, with a study of the interwar period (Treaty of Versailles, League of Nations, Causes of WW2). This is followed by a depth study on Germany from 1890-1945 (from Kaiser Wilhelm II to Hitler). As well as completing past exam questions throughout the year, there is a full mock exam paper in the Summer Term. Pupils will develop a range of historical skills, such as use of key terms, understanding and use of second order concepts (e.g. cause and consequence), analysis and evaluation of source material, and the development of historical interpretations, and coming to informed judgements. GCSE History builds on the development of skills seen in KS3, and applies them in an increasingly complex way, developing and extending their knowledge and skills still further.
