

## Year 11 History Curriculum Map

| Overview  | The GCSE History curriculum covers international, and British, history. Within Year 11 the focus is on British history, with a study of the Norman Conquest, and the impact that this had on England politically, socially and economically. There is also a depth study of a site designated by the exam board. This is followed by a synoptic study of health and medicine since the Middle Ages. Whilst largely taught chronologically, pupils develop an awareness of the factors running throughout the whole period in question. As well as completing past exam questions throughout the year, there is a full mock exam paper in the Autumn Term. Year 11 finishes with a focus on revision, including past papers, content revision, and a consideration of exam techniques. Across the course, and again within the revision period, students will develop skills such as use of key terms, understanding and use of second order concepts (e.g. cause and consequence), analysis and evaluation of source material, and the development of historical interpretations, and coming to informed judgements. GCSE History builds on the development of skills seen in KS3, and applies them in an increasingly complex way, developing and extending their knowledge and skills still further. The nature of the course means skills developed in Year 10 are also developed, and refined further in Year 11, rather than new skills being introduced. |   |  |   |  |                |
