This enables students to be able to play to their own strengths and talents Students will have the option to use music technology to develop their creativity and to allow them to compose for any type of instrument or ensemble It offers both un-seen works to be studied alongside more analytical study for 2 set works. The course therefore relies on them developing a musical response rather than merely learning facts to recite It prepares students for KS5 music for both academic and vocational courses which gives more scope at the end of year 11.
