

## Year 12 French Curriculum Map

Overview	The course will prepare students for AQA A-level French. The exam is linear, which means that students will sit all of their exams at the end of the 2-year course. The course is taught by 2 teachers (teaching different units) and supplemented with timetabled speaking practice in small groups once a week.  Students learn to communicate at a high level in French through the study of topical issues and cultural matters.  Authentic materials are used and drawn from many sources, including French media.  Students take responsibility for their own learning within a structured independent study schedule.  A significant amount of grammar is covered in the first term, developing complexity and also bridging the gap between GCSE and A Level.  Students have the opportunity for a week's work experience in France during Year 12 work experience week.  Assessments: At the end of each unit, summative assessments are set, covering A Level skills (Reading, Listening, Writing / translation and Speaking).  Students are given detailed written feedback on paper 2 practise essays, mock essays and speaking. Exam questions set in lessons, using the mark scheme and model answers, and grammatical exercises are examples where peer and self-assessment are used.  Students sit the AS paper as their Year 12 exams in the Summer Term.
