

### Percentage attendance and how much school has been missed

Attendance	Days absent	What this means
100%	0	Always present
90%	19	4 weeks (or <b>100 lessons</b> ) missed per year
85%	28.5	6 weeks missed per year, approximately half a term's absence
80%	38	8 weeks missed per year, equivalent to missing a whole year over 5 years from Y7-11
70%	57	More than a quarter of the year missed



#### Gift aid or donate


- If you can't help in person, please consider a small regular monthly donation as little as £1.
