Introduction:

The aim of our schemes of work is to promote consistency within the Spanish Department in order to plan and deliver lessons that challenge and engage all students and that allow teachers to use assessments effectively. These schemes of work should also give students the opportunity to learn about the world and different cultures and to show them the wide variety of opportunities that the future will offer them when they are able to speak another language. Languages Vision Statement (GD):

Spanish will inspire you to engage with the world, different societies and cultures, so that you can broaden your tolerance, adaptability, knowledge and thinking skills.

Languages introduction (GD):

You will develop your linguistic confidence in a safe and supportive environment in which you are encouraged to take risks. The lessons foster cooperation, collaboration and teamwork.

You will develop your linguistic skills through the use of authentic materials (songs, articles, stories) in a positive atmosphere. Your teachers are experts in building positive relationships and they will have high expectations of you to engage and adapt to the pace of your lessons. You will find teachers draw on their own experiences, which helps to take the subject outside of the classroom. You will be challenged to question where you have seen Spanish used in the wider world, out of school. You will be given the opportunity to participate in a residential visit abroad.

During year 7, students at Bishop Luffa have the opportunity to be taught 4 languages. Students will learn to analyse foreign languages and look for patterns and links with their mother tongue. They will start the year studying Latin and how languages evolved to then move into Modern Foreign Languages (German, French and Spanish). Pupils will also study the culture and lifestyle of the countries where these languages are spoken.

In the summer term, students are given the opportunity to independently explore and research languages in order to perform in the Languages Festival. They will also have the chance to complete activities in other languages such as, Swedish, Greek, Russian and Aboriginal by using the skills they have developed throughout the year to 'break the code'. At the end of the academic year students will choose the language they want to study from year 8 until the end of KS4.

Step information

Our students have a diverse experience of language learning from Primary school, including some students who speak another language at home.

Whilst students often have prior knowledge in at least one language they learn in year 7, we focus on the students building on language learning skills and therefore work at Step 1-2.
