Overview	During Year 9, we will be teaching students topics that will enable them to develop their conversations in German to communicate with friends (and family) should they travel to a German speaking country. They will also be able to write paragraphs about themselves adding more detail and expressing their points of view. They will be able to read and decode information in German and understand and respond successfully to questions in the target language. In addition, the cultural element of the SOW will allow students to discover other cultures and familiarise themselves with different styles of life.
